Please note: You will apply for your ARC 'alien card' as soon as you arrive on campus. It will take 4-6 weeks to arrive. You must not leave the country (for weekend trip to Japan ect) until you receive your ARC card, otherwise you will be denied re-entry into Korea!



## Let the Preparation begin! VISA application

- Spelling **MUST** be exactly the same as in your passport.



- ※ As there are countries such as Germany, Czech Republic, and Russia that have different alphabets, when filling out the application, please be sure to use **the same name as the one written at the bottom part of your passport**. Please pay attention to the symbol for the spacing of words ( < > ), also, be careful not to include the three-letter country code (e.g. RUS) written before your name.

Your passport must also have a minimum of 6 months remaining at the time you leave Korea. If not, please renew your passport before you apply for Hallym Exchange. Please check your passport now! (we need to input your current passport information into a government system to generate your certificate of admission). If you apply for Hallym exchange with a passport that has less than 6 months remaining, at the time you FINISH your exchange period at Hallym University, you will be rejected from the Hallym Exchange program.



### APPLYING FOR A VISA

Before making travel arrangements, you will need to obtain an appropriate visa.



### HEALTH INSURANCE

Buy your insurance which can cover the whole period of your stay in Korea. (Korean Health insurance is also mandatory)

### GETTING THE TUBERCULOSIS TEST

All enrolled students who live in the dormitory are required to complete the Tuberculosis screening test (conducted during the first week on campus for free).

**Depending upon your nationality, you may be also required to submit a TB certificate to the Korean Embassy in your home country for VISA issuance**

### APPLYING FOR FOREIGN REGISTRATION

ISSO will help you apply for foreign registration card (Alien Card)/ARC when you arrive on campus.

## Before you leave

### E-MAIL

Your e-mail account is the one that we will use to communicate with you. Thus, be sure to check your e-mail regularly to avoid missing any important information from us. Please save [gareth@hallym.ac.kr](mailto:gareth@hallym.ac.kr) and [iao55@hallym.ac.kr](mailto:iao55@hallym.ac.kr) (Gareth's second email) into your email, to avoid them being sent to your 'spam' folder. It is best if you provide two email addresses (your personal email + your .ac university email). Please make sure you write your email address correctly (Do not capitalise the first letter of your email address, unless that is how you made it).

### VISA

Please check with your university coordinator which office address they would like you to use for official postal communication between Hallym and your home university. Please give the full address details, listed on the application form (including ZIP code)



The business registration number of Hallym University is **221-82-05646**. You might need this number to apply for your visa, depending on your country. When you make your initial entrance into Korea, your visa must be for Hallym University.

■ **Please note** that this visa lets you travel to Korea **only one time** unless you apply for and get a Foreign Registration Card (Alien Card) which functions as a 'multiple entry visa.' **Once you leave Korea without the Foreign Registration Card, you must have a new visa to enter Korea again. You will apply for your Alien Card when you arrive at Hallym University. You will receive it approximately four to six weeks later.**

Please note that from spring 2021 all incoming International Students (including exchange students) will be required by law to sign up to Korean Medical Insurance.

## HEALTH INSURANCE

**Hallym University still encourages you to take out (comprehensive) international travel & medical insurance for your international exchange period in Korea, to cover any period at the start of the semester before your Korean Medical Insurance becomes active and for any travel period outside of Korea.**

**Please also be aware that if you test positive for COVID during your stay in Korea, it is likely that you will be sent to a COVID isolation facility for treatment.**

**Each individual is responsible for paying for any hospitalization, upfront before discharge (in cash, or by international bank transfer), regardless of whether the individual has active travel/medical insurance, or not.**

**In the event of a positive COVID test result, the affected student will not be able to live on campus until they test negative for COVID, having been released from the COVID facility.**

## COURSE REGISTRATION

For international exchange students, an updated list of classes for 2022 fall semester will be distributed by e-mail (likely to be in July 2022), before your arrival in Korea. During this time, you will have a one week period to select your course preferences. It is therefore vital that you regularly check your email. The list you currently have is from fall 2021 semester, so some of the courses may change slightly. Please use it as a guide, when selecting courses now.

You are asked to fill in a course registration form and return it to the International Coordinator at Hallym by e-mail. (July 2022). Your course requests will then (wherever possible) be booked for you. **\*please note that some courses may change, or be dropped. Some courses may also clash with other classes you have chosen\*** You will be given the opportunity to change classes (where seats are available), during your first week at Hallym.

During the International Orientation and 'Add-Drop period', the International Office will assist you in course registration.

**\*Please note, that seats may become available on courses, as other exchange students, or Korean students change classes, during the whole add/drop class period.\***

A class taught in English is automatically canceled, if less than 10 students register for that class. In other words, if 10 or more students register, the class will be delivered as planned.

International exchange students studying at Hallym must attend at least one regular class at the undergraduate level. **You must also study a minimum of 12 credits, up to a maximum of 18 credits.**

#### RECOMMENDED ARRIVAL DATE

Students should plan to arrive on campus in time to participate in the International Orientation. Students may also be required to 'self isolate' for 14 days on Hallym campus before the start of the academic semester. More information will follow about this in due course.

#### Directions to Hallym University

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**The 14:10 bus (terminal 1) 14:20 (terminal 2) is the final bus that will arrive in Chuncheon on time, for you to arrive at International Office, before it closes at 17:30. It is therefore recommended that your plane lands at Incheon Airport before 12.00.** There are plenty of affordable hotels nearby Incheon Airport (in Unseo dong) that will pick you up, and drop you back off at the airport the following morning, if you arrive later than this, or you may choose to travel to Chuncheon and stay in a motel overnight. The journey is very safe and easy!

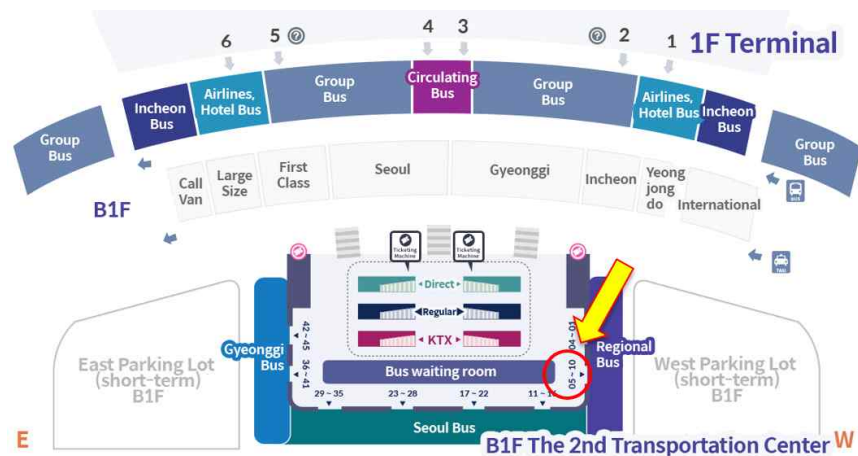

Please do not take a taxi to Hallym University from the Airport, the journey is almost 2 1/2 hours!

From INCHEON Int'l Airport (terminal 1) to CHUNCHEON (춘천) Bus Terminal (students landing in terminal 2, catch bus to terminal 1).

Students can move to CHUNCHEON where Hallym University is located using the Limousine bus at the Bus station outside the passenger terminal at Incheon International Airport.

## Things You Have To Do After Arrival

### CHECK-IN

Once you arrive on campus, your first destination should be ISSO (International Office) in order to arrange all the necessary processing (check-in accommodation, ID card, reviewing course registration and so forth)

#### **ISSO: 2nd floor, International Hall**

If lost/confused, show this message to anyone who is on our campus:

They will direct you to our office (opening hours 08.30 – 17:30)

Upon receiving your accommodation application, ISSO will reserve your room and you will be asked to pay for the room after settling down on campus (during the first week of the academic semester). Your buddy will help you with checking-in > **This dorm fee must be paid in cash** > International Bank Transfers are not possible > Hallym has several international ATM's on campus

### DORMITORY

For a smooth transition to campus life, you must arrive on campus during working hours. (08:30 ~ 17:30 Monday to Friday). **Please note there is currently a midnight curfew in Hall 8. Hallym International Dorm (currently) has no curfew. More information about your dorm options can be found in the link below:**

### TEMPORARY HOUSING

Temporary housing is available for students who want to arrive early in Korea (**subject to COVID-19 travel restrictions**), before the semester begins. Please inform us of your arrival date in advance, before booking any flights if you plan to arrive early. ([gareth@hallym.ac.kr](mailto:gareth@hallym.ac.kr)) (please note, you will be charged a daily rate for your accommodation when you arrive early). **\*Your normal housing selection will be charged from the first day of the semester, until the final day of the semester\***

- Temporary housing period : Please email [gareth@hallym.ac.kr](mailto:gareth@hallym.ac.kr) if you wish to arrive on campus early. (**subject to COVID control**)

### ORIENTATION FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

Exchange students are required to attend the International Student Orientation which will give you a lot of essential details about the university, immigration rules, how to register for classes, social activities, and recreational services. This will help you to achieve a smooth transition to your new environment.

**X-RAY TEST**

All enrolled students who live in the dormitory are required to complete the Tuberculosis screening test.

The TB test (chest X-ray) is typically conducted during the first week of the semester.

A bus comes to campus (with an X-Ray machine inside it) and students take the TB X-Ray on campus.

Since all international students stay in Korea more than 90 days, you are required to register at a local Immigration Office and apply for foreign registration card. ISSO will assist with this procedure once you arrive on campus.

This registration card functions as a multiple entry visa which makes it possible for you to re-enter without visa until your visa expiration date (as indicated on the foreign registration card).(COVID restrictions allowing)

2 color passport photos are required for the application **(35x45mm)** (please note this is a different size than a 'standard' USA/Turkish passport photo).

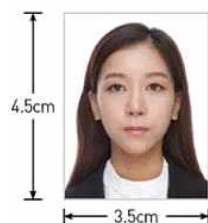

When you arrive on campus, you will be given a Alien Card application to complete. You must also pay ₩30,000 cash to ISSO + provide passport photos for your application. It is best if you bring these passport photos with you from your home country, as Hallym does not have a passport photo machine on campus.

## INTERNET

### ACCESS + Phones

We have free Wi-Fi zones throughout the entire campus; including the dormitories. Please ask for the Wi-Fi password, when you arrive at International Office.

A mobile phone provider will visit Hallym University during your first few days on campus. During this time, you can sign up to Korean phone coverage, if you wish. Typically this SIM card is initially for 90 days and costs ₩70,000. This plan gives you unlimited phone calls (within Korea and unlimited data (although the speed may be restricted slightly).

Cash machines are available throughout the city and on campus. We recommend you to bring at least one credit card with which you can withdraw cash. Master card and VISA are accepted across Korea (although VISA is more commonly accepted). Please inform your local bank in your home country about your plans to stay in Korea to avoid blocking the use of your cards at overseas ATMs.

## BANKING & CREDIT CARDS & CASH –

You will need some cash when you arrive, to pay for bedding (if you ordered), immigration alien card, Key card deposit ect. You will also need to pay for your accommodation after a few days, (international bank transfers are NOT possible), so you will need access to cash, via withdrawal from a cash machine. (we do not advise travelling from your home country with a large amount of cash). Typically Korean banks limit cash withdrawal at around ₩200-300,000 per withdrawal, so you may need to make several withdrawals to pay for your accommodation.

**\*Please note, if the 14 day COVID self isolation is required, you must also bring cash to pay for this AS YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS. You must therefore bring this cash with you from your home country (Korean Won) > More information will follow about this.**

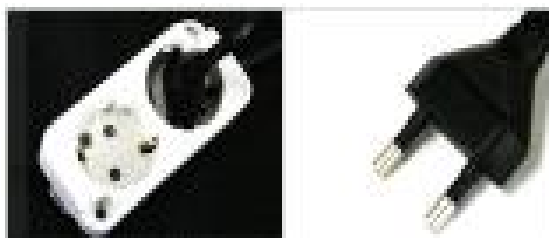

## ELECTRICITY

Electrical current in Korea is 220v. Students should bring all their electronic devices and adaptors that are able to convert to this voltage.



## MEALS ON CAMPUS

You may buy meals at the University Cafeterias. There are three cafeterias on campus; each meal costs between \$3 ~ \$4. If you buy meals off campus, it usually starts from \$4 ~ \$5.

## WORKING IN KOREA

International exchange students are allowed to work off campus with permission of the Korean Immigration Service. **For students staying for one semester this is almost impossible for you to achieve. (you cannot begin any paid, or unpaid work off campus without informing Hallym University International Office + Korean Immigration) FIRST.**

For more information please speak to ISSO. Ignorance of the rules is no excuse in the eyes of Korean Immigration.

Paid employment on campus is allowed without permission from the Korean Immigration Service.

Paid employment on campus is achieved by applying for (and being

accepted into) Hallym International Dorm (**HID**).

You must apply for HID **before** you arrive in Korea, via the housing application form + selecting the 'tutor' option.

HID tutoring selection usually takes place during the first week of the semester. More information will be provided during our on campus orientation.

### **What is HID?**

■ Hallym International Dormitory (HID) is an intensive language and culture program at Hallym University. Hallym students who are interested in developing their language and cultural understanding live and study together with visiting exchange students here. The dormitory is organized into four different language sections (English / Chinese / Japanese / Russian). The dormitory itself houses approximately 160 students of which 33% are from other countries while the majority are Korean students. Therefore, as an exchange student living in HID, you can learn more about Korea from students who are most suited to assist you, and you can meet a variety of students from other countries.

### **Exchange**

#### **Students**

#### **(English Section)**

■ As an exchange student at Hallym University, you can apply to live in HID as a resident. You need a minimum of intermediate level English good enough for everyday conversations. You will share a room with one or two Korean students (three students per room). Therefore, you will have lots of opportunities to learn more about Korea and build new friendships. Most students consider the friendships and memories as the most rewarding aspect of their time in HID.

If you choose to live in HID (and tutor) you must take a mandatory HID course (2 credit, 2 hours a week), with the other international tutors + Korean students living in HID (If you want to be a tutor and you are selected to be a tutor).

You must take this 2 credit course, even if it is 'non transferable'(for credit) to your home institution. Refusal to take the course, or lack of attendance will result in expulsion from

### Hallym International Dorm (HID).

■ Due to the limited space available in the dormitory, it may be necessary for all students to be interviewed. For students overseas, this can be done over the phone, or upon your arrival on campus (to decide tutors). The phone interview will take approximately 10 minutes (if needed). The purpose of the interview is to assess your suitability to the program as well as your understanding of cultural diversity. Please understand that your place in HID is not guaranteed, even if you apply for it, until you have been personally and formally notified of your acceptance. If you apply for HID, please give a second housing option in case your application is unsuccessful.

#### Exchange Student Tutors (English Section)

■ As an exchange student, you can also apply to be a tutor. Tutors should be proficient in English at an academic level (i.e. they regularly study in English). They should also have the maturity, organizational skills, and leadership skills needed to lead a group of Korean students in their study. Cultural awareness is also an asset as a tutor because it will help them understand how different cultures view situations differently. They will be selected through an interview in the first week of the semester. **(you can only apply to tutor if you are living in HID, which you must apply for before you arrive in Korea.)**

■ As a tutor, you will be required to:

◦ Attend 2 hours of lecture and host 2 hours of (compulsory) seminar per week. The lectures focus on developing understanding of current issues through student-driven discussions. The work is designed to encourage students to look at topics and issues in new ways from a different cultural perspective. Seminars are held during the evenings in which groups of 5-7 students work in teams on a variety of lecture related work and language development.

◦ Attend a small number of events throughout the semester that all students are encouraged to attend.

◦ Assist students with their language development and cultural



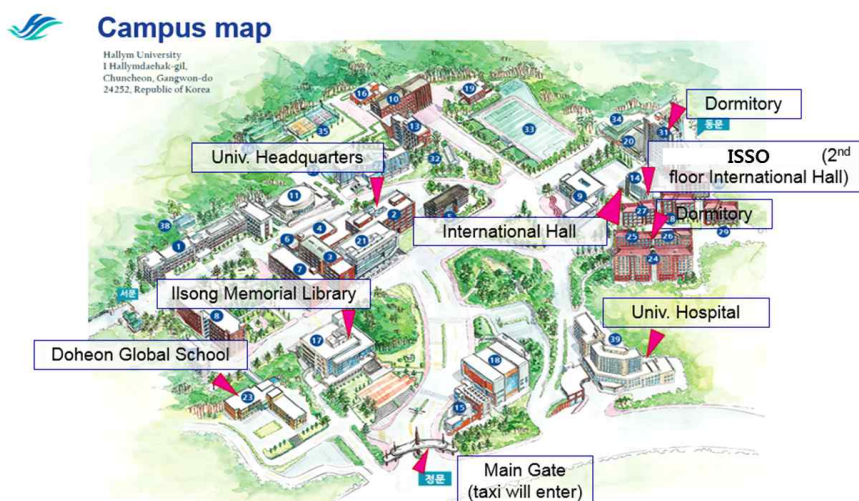
understanding. This is usually done on an informal basis.

■ As a tutor, you will be compensated with:

◦Free accommodation for the whole semester (valued at **724,000 won**). > You must still pay this housing fee at the start of the semester > If selected to be a HID tutor, it is refunded at the end of the semester.

◦A scholarship ranging from **300,000 won to 600,000 won**. The final amount depends on an assessment of your participation in the program (and the amount of tutors teaching).
