Writing an application letter, developing a succinct summary or annotation, accurately paraphrasing, quoting and citing sources, elaborating on ideas, completing a research paper, developing academic posters, etc.

Duration: 40 hours

Cost: \$600 CDN

Total of 3 Weeks
